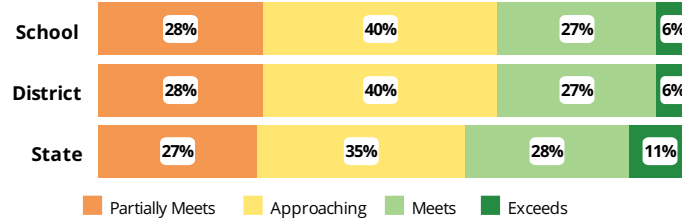

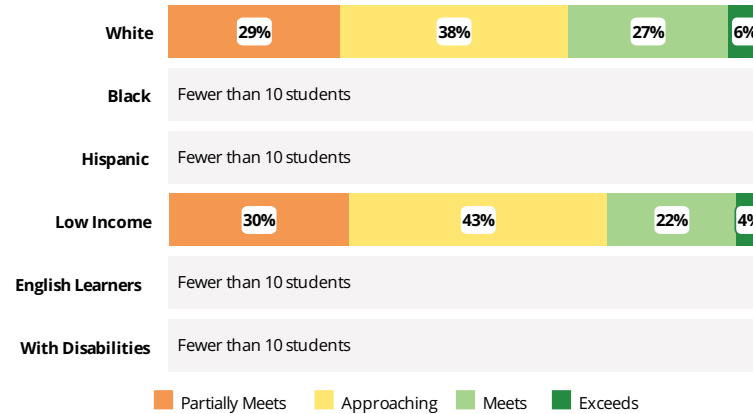
Academic Success

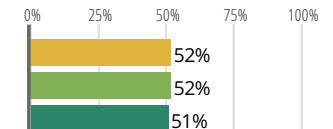

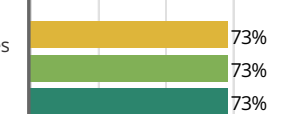

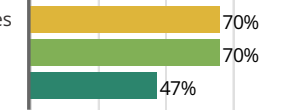
Postsecondary Enrollment

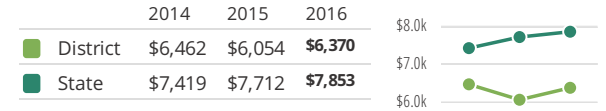

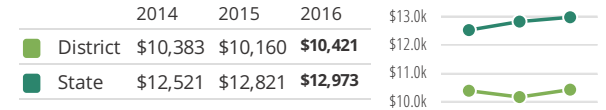

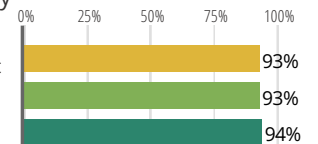
Educator Measures
